The 2019 Spark Junior Program will take place over 6 weeks, starting in January 2019.

This is a program for children and their families to learn the activities that will encourage a generous spirit in the next generation.

Spark will invite approximately 20 motivated families with children ages 7 to 14, who have demonstrated initiative to create positive change in their community to participate in this exciting and creative program.

Cost of the Program: The cost of the program including uniforms, speaker, sessions, course material and field trips is \$2,500.00 per student. \$800.00 of this cost is eligible for a charitable tax receipt.

- Program Delivery - \$2,080.00
- Transport - \$120.00

INTRODUCTION TO PHILANTHROPY & SOCIAL ETIQUETTE

Welcome To Philanthropy 101!

This seminar will provide an overview and comprehensive introduction to the importance and history of philanthropy as well as the concepts and theories, emerging trends, and the key debates and ethical issues surrounding philanthropy and charity.

SESSION 1

FINANCIAL LITERACY FOR KIDS

Finance Isn't Just For The Adults

This session will explore the basics of financial literacy from money management to responsible investing to ensure families can make informed and effective decisions with all of their financial resources.

Test out your new money management skills with a trip to and a spending challenge! Kids will be tasked with managing a sustainable food budget for one week. They will then be given an allocation of dollars to spend at Price-Pro, Canada's only non-for-profit grocery store and Urban Fare Shangri-La. Students must not exceed this budget.

Their purchases are then donated to 10 local families in need of groceries identified by the Boys & Girls Club of South Coast BC.

THE POWER OF GIVING

Learn Not Just How to Cook, But How to Cook For A Cause!

Students learn to bake fun and simple recipes such as cookies, scones, and muffins and are encouraged to share their creations with family, friends and the hungry.
